All You Need Is To;

1. Be between 18 - 60 years of age, strong and a healthy maize farmer that farms in any of the 3 Northern Regions.
2. Form a group of 8 - 12 members including chairman, secretary and a treasurer as the executives.
3. Join a group willing to secure a large parcel of land of 20 - 50 acre (minimum) for block farming. This acreage must be demarcated into individual plots of 5 - 10 acres.
4. Submit two (2) recent passport size photographs for the group formation.
5. Submit a Ghanaian voter's ID card.

Once Your Group Is Formed You Must;


1. Be properly registered and open a group bank account with a reputable bank near you.
2. Collect group dues from members to operate your group bank account.
3. Ensure that all members work as a group and continue to do so.
4. Be willing, as members of the group, to adopt all improved technology as recommended by the Savannah Agriculture & Research Institute and other reputable research institutions.
5. Not be involved in joint farming where the yield has to be shared into 2 or 3 parts at the end of the season. Sharing is only acceptable after all input costs / credits have been paid for.

1. Fertilizer – NPK 23.10.05 (Special maize fertilizer) & Urea 46% N
2. Herbicide – Lumax
3. Insecticide – Karate 5 EC
4. Maize seed – Proseed (Local variety or hybrid)
5. Matabi Knapsack Sprayer
6. One optional double dibbler
7. One optional bullock plough complete with ridger body
